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Our Nursery

At Brackenfield's nursery, we aim to give our children the best possible start, so they are happy, confident, active, sociable, and ready for school. Whether in the Wrens Class (2-3-year-olds) or the Robins Class (3-4-year-olds), children enjoy age-appropriate activities that allow each one to extend their social, communication, and thinking skills alongside their problem-solving capabilities. We aim to identify each child's unique interests and abilities, planning activities that will engage and inspire them to discover more about the world around them.

Led by our experienced Nursery Manager Katie Kerr, our qualified team delivers a comprehensive curriculum following the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) guidelines, incorporating a mix of structured and informal activities that foster inspiring learning through play.

Brackenfield Nursery offers a stimulating environment for young children, featuring well-equipped classrooms, space for music and indoor play, and an expansive playground with engaging resources. As part of the main school, we benefit from exceptional facilities and expert teachers. Children have weekly French and Music lessons with specialist staff, and they look forward to their twice-weekly sessions of sports in the main hall. With a strong focus on family, we celebrate special occasions like Mothers' and Father's Days, creating a warm and welcoming atmosphere.

Our Nursery is a thriving component of our school community. The participation in school life by our youngest pupils means that once they are ready for the move up to Reception, the transition is seamless. Their familiarity with the school environment and surroundings contributes to a smooth and comfortable transition process. During the summer term of every year, the children take part in a 'moving up morning' which gives them another opportunity to meet their new class teacher and take part in taster activities. These visits excite and familiarise the children before they move up a year group in September.

Reception to Year 6

At Brackenfield School the academic curriculum is divided into three main stages: Early Years (Age 2-5) Infants (Age 5-7) and Juniors (Age 7-11). Each child enjoys lessons in maths, English, science and the humanities as well as opportunities for French, music, drama, ICT, PSHCE, art, design technology and sport within the normal teaching timetable.

We operate a varied curriculum which ties together elements of many different subjects under a theme, encouraging children to develop a love of learning and a thirst for knowledge. This integrated approach across subjects, with teaching input from music, language and sports specialists, allows all the children the opportunity to demonstrate their strengths. Positive experiences in the classroom deepen children's understanding and support

progression across the rest of the curriculum. When children enjoy their learning, know how to learn and are motivated to work hard they become prepared for, and excited by, all that school can offer.

We have high expectations for our pupils and prepare them for their next schools through stimulating classwork, independent study, practice exam papers and a range of activities that increase resilience, determination, independence and leadership.

Our size is truly our strength: we know every child in the school and can tailor the curriculum and learning to suit. This is one of the reasons we are so successful in getting children their first-choice senior schools and why so many of our children are awarded scholarships to local independent senior schools.

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Pupils' attitudes to their work are excellent. From the earliest age, they invariably engage with commitment and enthusiasm with their learning.

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Creativity and Expression

Music, Drama and Art are important elements of the curriculum for all pupils at Brackenfield School. Not only do they develop areas of talent they also support children's confidence and communication skills. The three departments frequently work closely together on productions of outstanding quality where the performances surpass all expectations for a small school.

There are many opportunities to participate in our school orchestra, junior choir, or percussion ensembles. Formal and informal concerts are organised throughout the year, and our students are encouraged to perform at our weekly assemblies. Junior choir is available each week for those children who would like to participate. These activities help to give children the confidence they require to perform in public, which will be an invaluable asset during both their school and working life.

Our dedicated team of peripatetic teachers offer a large range of instruments for one-to-one teaching, including piano, guitar, drums and violin. Additionally, we offer singing lessons, speech and drama coaching and art classes. If pupils are looking for a talent, we can help them find it. If they already have a talent, we can help them excel!

Enrichment

In addition to our curriculum and strong focus on learning, pupils are actively involved in various activities during the school week. We are committed to providing pupils with opportunities to explore new interests, develop their strengths and pursue their passions. A vital part of the Brackenfield pupil experience is to become immersed in the performing arts, sports or various other enriching activities. It is also a wonderful way for children to get to know those from other year groups, and further instils our family ethos.

We understand that children can greatly benefit from learning experiences in and out of the classroom. Trips and excursions provide valuable opportunities for children to broaden their horizons and deepen their knowledge of the world. Each year group has the chance to go on different trips, including visits to zoos, farm parks, museums, and more.

Our older children also benefit from residential trips such as PGL, as well as an overseas trip to Paris once they reach Year 5 and 6.

After school, we have an extensive extra-curricular programme that includes support with homework, to other clubs such as games, coding, wildlife as well as other sporting activities. We understand that parents often have busy lives, and working between school hours can be a struggle. Here at Brackenfield, we offer wraparound care to help support where we can before and after school. Parents can drop their children off at 7:30 am for our breakfast club. After school, we offer a wide choice of extra-curricular activities from 3:30 pm until 4:30 pm. We also provide extended after-school care until 5:55 pm. This provides the peace of mind that comes from knowing your children are happy and busy too.

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Learning Outdoors

While we embrace technology to inspire, energise, and transform learning, we also make sure that our children maintain a strong sense of balance in their appreciation of human connections, nature, and the outdoors. By understanding and engaging with the outdoors, our pupils are encouraged to become better stewards of the world. They develop respect, empathy, and ideas for sustainability. Forest School takes place both within and beyond our school site. We are lucky to be endowed with many leafy trees and specific outdoor learning areas on site.

Our Forest School sessions are enjoyed by children from every year group. From Nursery to Year 6, our pupils can spend time outdoors where they can learn new skills. They learn how to build dens, make woodland art and often use the campfire for outdoor cooking. The benefits of learning outdoors are in abundance as children develop their teamwork and collaboration skills, their imagination and curiosity, but above all, being outdoors is beneficial to wellbeing.

Competition and Cooperation

Sport plays a very important role in the curriculum for all age groups at Brackenfield. We are very fortunate to have our own playing fields across the road and use of the best swimming facilities in Harrogate, with three pools and highly qualified instructors. Our experienced and dedicated games staff work closely with all pupils and motivate them to achieve their full potential. Each term they arrange and manage extremely busy fixture lists of competitive matches against other local schools.

At Brackenfield all children are encouraged to play with and compete against their classmates from an early age. All sports are played competitively in both single-sex and mixed matches where possible.

All children enjoy games and PE lessons where they develop their co-ordination, ball skills and general fitness. There is a dynamic programme of introduction to new sports and activities throughout the year to encourage children to try new skills and to keep healthy doing an activity they enjoy. Although we are a small school, we are very proud to boast current and past Olympians as well as professional footballers and golfers.

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Pupils throughout the school are successful in music and drama examinations, sport and art.

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Community

Brackenfield School has a strong family ethos that has permeated our history. Family is at the heart of the school, and this allows us to be united, friendly, safe and comforting. Empowered by these values our pupils reach out into the wider community both near and far.

We recognise our potential to make a positive impact through acts of service and charity. This commitment drives us to explore and support community projects both individually and as a school, while also emphasising the importance of kindness and determination in advocating for charitable causes. As part of our community involvement, our school regularly participates in organized litter picks in the Harrogate area. We have also fostered a meaningful connection with two local care homes, where the pupils visit every month, bringing joy and companionship to the elderly residents. Additionally, our school council is proactive in organising various events throughout the year to raise funds for our three chosen school charities.

We understand, respect and embrace diversity of our community through learning opportunities in our curriculum and our behaviour outside of school.

Pastoral and Emotional Well-being

The personal health and well-being of all our pupils is very important to everyone at Brackenfield. Pupils are all part of a form, where they share important social and circle time with their peers and their form teacher, as well as teaching time. All staff are available to pupils to deal with any concerns they may have. Pupils are encouraged to share their concerns and ask for help if they need it. On arrival, each pupil is allocated one of our four houses. House activities play a key part in the whole-school events throughout the year, including inter-house competitions. We are one of the very few small schools nationally to have a dedicated Director of Welfare as well as trained Mental Health first aid members of staff.



Beyond Brackenfield

We are passionate about ensuring that our Year 6 pupils are given responsibilities to help them prepare for the real world, so fostering leadership skills is top priority for teaching staff. We offer a broad range of leadership opportunities throughout the school, these include, House captains, school council roles, classroom monitors and many more. The pupils also enjoy accompanying parents around their school during open events where they proudly showcase Brackenfield to new audiences.

Our Year 6 pupils are repeatedly offered scholarship awards for Academics, Performing Arts and Drama, and Sports. Over the years, Brackenfield's Year 6 pupils are consistently offered places in their first-choice senior schools many of which are independent.

Our small size and strong connections with families enable us to effectively prepare students for their chosen path. We provide individualised support to prepare pupils for any entrance exams or interviews. Brackenfield pupils are well-prepared and confident, which has led to a positive reputation in senior schools. Last year, our destination schools for Year 6 leavers included Harrogate Ladies College, The Grammar School at Leeds and Harrogate Grammar School.

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Pupils demonstrate an excellent understanding of the importance of wise decision-making and its role in determining their future successes.
